Entry Requirements

- ✓ QQI level 6 Childcare Major award (120 ECTS credits) or comparable
- If you don't hold QQI level 6 Childcare Major award (120 ECTS credits) you can enter Stage 1 or complete QQI level 6 to advance to Stage 2 or complete an RPL form (recognition of prior learning)
- English proficiency If English is not your first language you must achieve one of the following scores in an English exam:
 - IELTS score 6.0 or above
 - Duolingo score of 95 or higher
 - Cambridge score of FCE or higher
 - Any assessment CEFR B2+ or higher
- Sufficient IT skills

How Online Learning Works

Students can study from home through Chevron's Virtual Learning Environment and engage with weekly study resources at times that suit their own schedule.

There are weekly live webinars to further support students' learning, which students find extremely beneficial. These are recorded, therefore, if students cannot attend the content is accessible online after the live session.

Learners will be required to attend an in-house session at the start of each semester.

Following the completion of each module students will have developed and gathered the knowledge, understanding and weekly feedback to enable them to complete their final assessment.

Professional Practice Placement is a requirement at all 4 stages of this programme, with 35% of the programme allocated for placement.

Programme Content

Stage 2 & 3 (120 Credits)

Stages 2 & 3 will provide students with a broader and more reflective understanding of the key areas and concepts pertaining to the role of the Early Childhood Educator.

Students will evaluate current early years practice from a global and national context and will examine strategies and practices to ensure a high-quality early years environment, with an emphasis on promoting children's rights, creativity, inclusion, equality and collaborative practice.

Students will further develop their professional practice and emerge as ethical and transformative leaders.
